Many organisations have adopted her name or use an image of her as their logo.



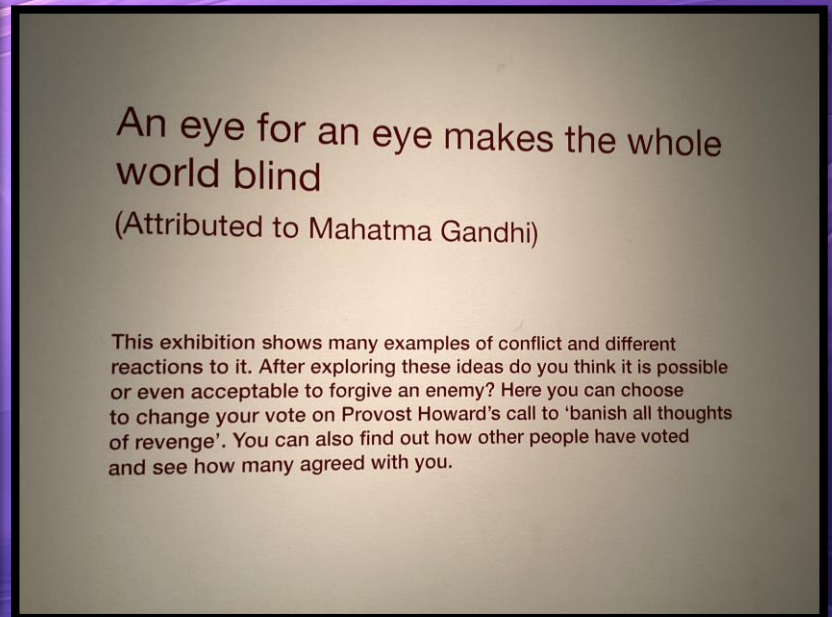

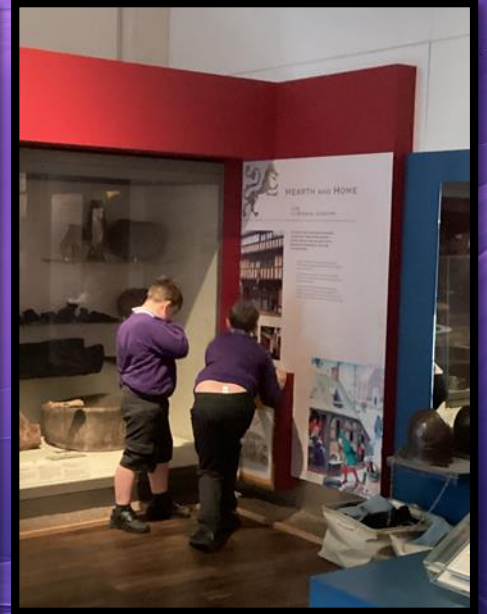

Many organisations use an image of her as their logo.

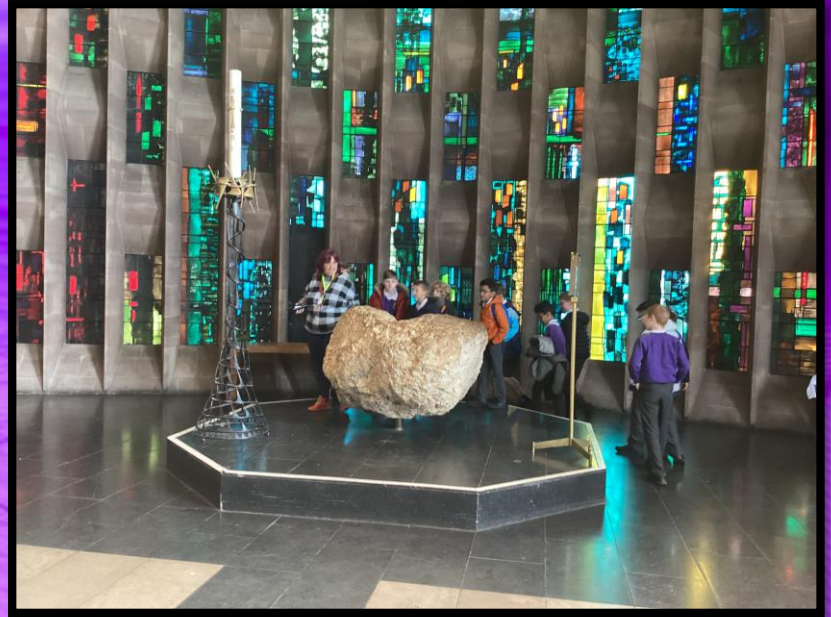

THE CHARRED CROSS

On the night of 14th November 1940 two medieval beams fell from the roof of the burning cathedral and landed in the form of a cross. It has become a powerful symbol of rebirth and reconciliation for Coventry.
