In Year 1, children will be taught to... -Begin to name the countries of the UK and its surrounding areas. -Identify characteristics of the four countries that make up the UK. -Use aerial photographs to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features. -Identify the location of hot areas in the world. -Understand the similarities and differences through human and physical geography of a small area of the UK. (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Antarctica and Australia and oceans of the world Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Arctic, and Southern) -Use aerial photographs and forward-facing photographs to recognise and describe landmarks associated with the seaside (sand, beach huts, sea, buildings, roads)	In Year 3, children will be taught to... - Describe the location and some of the basic human and physical features of the place I am studying. - Identify the position and significance of Equator, N. and S. Hemisphere. - describe and understand key aspects and processes of Physical geography for the place I'm studying. - Describe and understand key aspects and processes of Human geography for the place I'm studying, including types of settlement. - Describe how changes in the Human and Physical environments affect the people living there.

Key Vocabulary

Seaside, Coast, Beach, Cliff, Harbour, Lighthouse, Island

Seaside	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort.
Coast	The part of the land adjoining or near the sea.
Beach	A pebbly or sandy shore, especially by the sea between high- and low-water marks.
Cliff	A steep rock face, especially at the edge of the sea.
Harbour	A place on the coast where ships may moor in shelter, especially one protected from rough water by piers, jetties, and other artificial structures.
Lighthouse	A tower or other structure containing a beacon light to warn or guide ships at sea.
Island	A piece of land surrounded by water.
