



Message from the Head

Dear Parents/Carers. Thank you to all parents who attended the **year 3 and year 4 parents meetings** this week, hope you have found it useful and informative.

We are taking part in **Warwickshire Safe and Active schools award**. We are aiming to:

- Improve the road safety knowledge of our students, making our students Safer road users and reducing risk taking behaviour.
- Improve the road safety knowledge of parents, carers and families of our students.
- Reduce traffic congestion close to school and address inconsiderate parking.



There will be a number of activities running across the year to support us with this. Year 3 and year 5 are soon to start BikeAbility, please make sure you have completed the booking form that was sent out from your class teacher a.s.a.p. to enable your child to participate. Related to this we have received further complaints about cars parking opposite the junction of Derwent Road and Ambleside Road, and partially blocking a drive by parking on the white line in front of the drop down kerb, sometimes called a 'H' bar or access protection line. Please ensure you are not causing an obstruction when parking and that the entire white line remains visible. You must not park opposite or within 10 metres of a junction except in an authorised parking space which are not present on Derwent, Ambleside or Grasmere Roads.

Thank you to those who supported our impromptu **cake sale** on Thursday, we raised a further £75 towards the Macmillan appeal.

Well done to all our **House Captains and House Ambassadors** who have been recently elected.
