



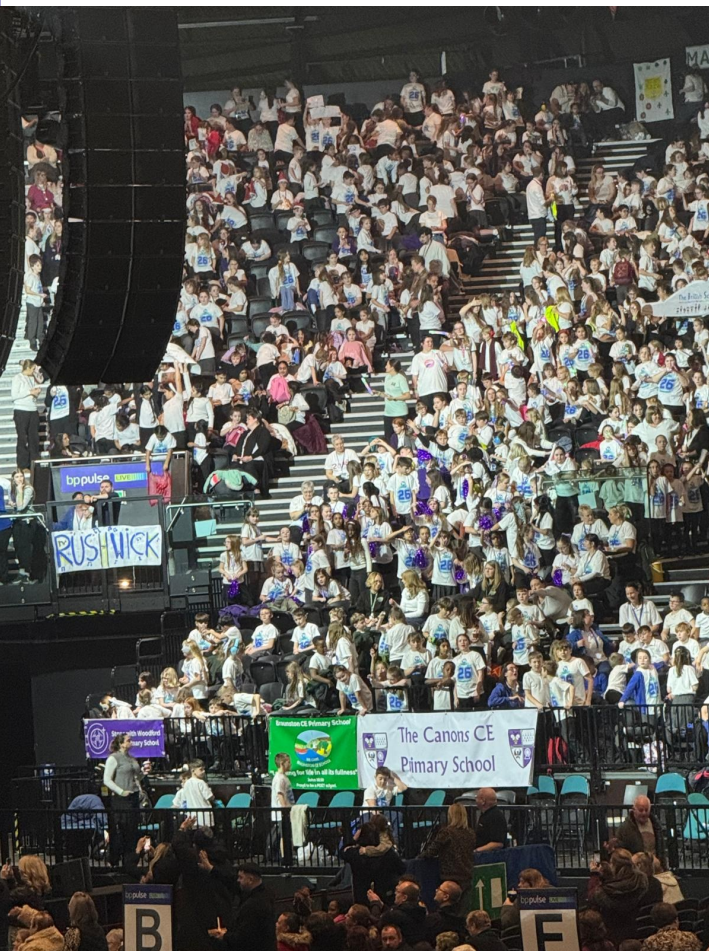
Message from the Head

Dear Parents/Carers. **Thank you so much** for the difference you have made today. We have been overwhelmed by the generosity of the parents to support a member of staff. The teacher concerned wont mind me sharing that she was totally overwhelmed today and had to take a moment out of class as she was very emotional. This is totally understandable given what they have been through. She has felt the wealth of support from our school community and would like to express her sincere gratitude for the support this will provide.

Thank you to those parents who attended the **SATs evening on Thursday**. I hope you found it useful and informative. We will put the presentation slides onto the website for those who missed it. It is an important year for the children and when parents are equally prepared and know how to support it is always a great benefit.

Our **year 5 children have to exit gate 3 every day at the end of school**. This means 90 children with their teachers. They have priority to exit. Lower school parents and children should be exiting using gate 1 or 2, not walking up the green path to exit gate 3 unless you are prepared to wait until year 5 have been dismissed safely. On Thursday a grandparent with a young child was swearing in front of staff and children that they were blocking the gate. We are grateful that the majority of our parents know how to conduct themselves on the school site. Please remember this is year 5's exit point and everyone else should be using another gate and walking on the pavement. If other care givers collect your child and do not have access to this newsletter, please ensure they are given this information as well.

The session should finish at about 4pm. The weather has been very wet recently - please dress appropriately for our outdoor session in the farm area near gate 1.
